MEDIA LITERACY TALK

On 22 August 2017, Thanakorn Thongprayoon was invited by Faculty of Education to give a talk on Building Media Literacy for a group of student teachers (five-year program) enrolling on the course “Civic Education”. At the beginning of the talk, he explained that his team have been working on the MEDLIT project funded by the European Union.

During the talk, students enthusiastically discussed regarding the media situation in Thailand and the level of media literacy of Thai people they acknowledge. At the end of the talk, students were asked to create a lesson of any subject integrating and focusing on building media literacy. Consequently, representatives from each group were presenting their initiatives and ideas to the audience. All participants gave critiques, feedbacks and suggestions to presenters for improvement and implementation.
